1. Call to Order, President's Remarks, Welcome

2. Treasurer's Report - Gill

- Current account balances:
 - **Main Account:** \$18,484.37
 - **Gaming Account:** \$5,100
 - Total Funds: \$23,584.37

3. Tech Budget Plans - Megan

- The school has requested \$10,000 to replace aging iPads.
- Pizza Lunch Plan Organized by Lisa Charlston.
 - Budget approval was requested for the next 2-3 lunches.

4. Hot Lunch Update - Chelsea

 - Cost Details:
 - Regular price: \$7.60 (this includes \$1 upcharge).
 - Discounted meals for VSB meal program families: \$3.60.

 - **Discounted Lunch Costs:** Ces't-Mon Café will charge \$3.60 for donated meals.
 - 100% discount for VSB meal plan participants.
 - 25% discount (on the honor system) for other families as needed.
 - \$1 from will hopefully sustain the 25% discount and the 3.60 cost to PAC for the donated meals
 - Note: Hot Lunch is about PAC offering a service, not fundraising

7. Principal's Report

- Staffing:
 - Could the school website, particularly the list of classes/divisions/teachers be updated for this year? Thank you
 - Permanent SSA position filled by Jay Charity.
 - Temporary SSA extended through March 2025 Ms. Ai
- School Website Updates:
 - \circ $\;$ All staff and class division information has been updated.
- Extracurricular Activities:
 - Senior boys' and girls' basketball teams start next week.
 - Field Trips:
 - Divisions 1-4: Ethos Lab.
 - Divisions 5-11: Science of Magic (on-site).
- September Pro-D Day:
 - What day is Mount Pleasant choosing for the September ProD Day? It helps to know early so we can make travel plans.
 - Selected in May of the previous school year.
- Lunchroom Concerns:
 - Since lunch was changed to the lunch room, my kindergartener barely eats any of his lunch and I've heard the same from other primary parents. I've asked my child why he's no longer eating his lunch and he says he doesn't know but I think the lunch room is too loud and hectic and the teachers are no longer there to encourage their students to eat. I'm also surprised by the significant reduction of outdoor, unstructured playtime, which I've always read helps kids to decompress and regulate themselves. Were the primary teachers really in favour of this change because the ones I've spoken to weren't? Was there a vote amongst teachers on these changes?
 - Noise levels in the lunchroom and decreased outdoor playtime are being monitored.
 - Teachers are actively encouraging kindergarteners to eat.
- Bathroom Repairs:
 - I wondered if there are any plans to make repairs to the bathrooms? My daughter let me know that the upstairs girls' bathroom has one stall without a door and two stalls where the toilet seem to have problems - continuing to run after you flush them or getting clogged regularly. Particularly for smaller kids, they can get easily freaked out by weird bathroom situations!
 - Plumbing issues are being addressed by an on-site plumber.
 - Summer repairs are necessary but often put on hold because of summer school
 - Longer-term design updates for better functionality are being explored. Plans to improve the bathroom design for younger students will be examined after the important and necessary issues are taken care of first.

- As part of the BC Physical Health Education curriculum, we are welcoming the WATARI STAR program to teach students about the impacts of personal choices on health and well-being and learn strategies to prevent substance use.
- The WATARI STAR program is contracted through Vancouver Coastal Health and consists of 4 one-hour sessions:
- Grade 7 Camp (May 14-16; note: its before May long weekend):
 - Cost per student: \$325.
 - Camp information session Thursday, Feb 13th at 6pm all parents are strongly encouraged to attend
 - PAC support was requested for bus subsidy.

 - We will be hosting a 'Share-Out' on March 5th and parents are invited
 - This will an afternoon performance and not an evening performance
 - Practice on the 4th and performance on the 5th
 - Perhaps we could send this via PAC channels and people they know to source this opportunity?
 - Request for a videographer and photographer to capture the performance.
- Emotional Wellbeing Surveys:
 - MDI and EDI Middle Years Development Instrument and Early
 - Development Instrument (Grade 6's and K's)- will be conducted Jan/Feb
 - This project will help us understand how children think and feel about their lives, both inside and outside of school during ages 9 to 13 (middle childhood years). Students in Grade 6 will be asked to share their views by answering questions on the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI). The MDI asks about areas of child development that are strongly linked to well-being, health and academic achievement. The project is administered by researchers at the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia (UBC) in partnership with school districts. Schools, governments and communities can use MDI information to improve supports and services for children.
 - Student Learning Surveys for Grades 4 and 7
 - Ministry of Education is asking all Gr 4 and 7 students to complete this survey – this is a survey dedicated to look at the following: <u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/stude</u> <u>nt-learning-survey</u>
 - Is this emotional survey done every year? Did they do them last year do them? If so are there any trends you can share?
